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## Level III.1 Adult Admission Criteria Summary

### Criteria Dimensions

### Level III.1 Clinically-Managed Low Intensity Residential Services

DIMENSION 1: Alcohol Intoxication and/or Withdrawal Potential	Patient not at risk of withdrawal, or is experiencing minimal or stable withdrawal. The patient is concurrently receiving Level 1-D (minimal or Level II-D (moderate) Services.
DIMENSION 2: Biomedical Conditions and Complications	None or stable, or Patient is receiving concurrent medical monitoring.
DIMENSION 3: Emotional/Behavioral/ Cognitive Conditions and Complications	None or minimal; not distracting to recovery. If stable: Co-Occurring Capable Program is appropriate. If not stable: Co-Occurring Enhanced Program of III.3 or higher is required.
DIMENSION 4: Readiness to Change	Patient is open to recovery, but needs a structured environment to maintain therapeutic gains.
DIMENSION 5: Relapse/Continued Use/ Continued Problem Potential	Patient understands relapse but needs structure to maintain therapeutic gains.
DIMENSION 6: Recovery Environment	Patient's environment is dangerous, but recovery is achievable if Level III.1 24-hour structure is available.
